

## NOTICE OF MODIFICATION ORDER

Section 53 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981

### SOUTH GLOUCESTERSHIRE COUNCIL DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT

#### **SOUTH GLOUCESTERSHIRE COUNCIL (FOOTPATH BETWEEN BROAD LANE AND FROG LANE, COALPIT HEATH) DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER 2019**

The above Order made on 22 March 2019, if confirmed as made, will modify the definitive map and statement for the area by adding to them the footpath commencing at Point A (Grid Ref. ST 6821 8020) where it joins with public restricted byway LWE 37 and the adopted highway on Broad Lane, running north eastwards along the bed of an old mineral railway track for a distance of 80m where it passes under a railway bridge and then continues for 560m to Point B (Grid Ref. ST 6847 8078) where it joins with public footpath LWE 18.

Any representation or objection relating to the order must be sent in writing to the Head of Legal, Governance and Democratic Services at the undermentioned address quoting reference L3/DS/STOR/PT.5525 not later than **21 May 2019**, and applicants are requested to state the grounds on which it is made. Please note that all representations received may be considered in public by the Council and that the substance of any representation together with the name and address of the person making it could become available for public inspection.

If no such representations or objections are duly made to the order, or if any so made are withdrawn, the South Gloucestershire District Council, instead of submitting the order to the Secretary of State may itself confirm the order. If the order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment, any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent with it.
