

## NOTICE OF MAKING OF AN ORDER

### HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

#### SOUTH GLOUCESTERSHIRE COUNCIL (FOOTPATH KW 17 (PART) BETWEEN HOLMWOOD AND TUDOR ROAD, HANHAM) PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION AND DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER 2019

The above order, made on 10 April 2019, under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980, will divert that part of public footpath KW 17 at Hanham that runs from Point A (Grid Ref. ST 6443 7235) at the corner of the surfaced path behind No. 28 Holmwood north westwards for 27m through a wall and two parking spaces to Point B (Grid Ref. ST 6441 7238) in the parking area between Holmwood and Tudor Road to a line running from the said Point A (Grid Ref. ST 6443 7235) west north westwards for 7m thence continuing through a staggered barrier and on for a further 1 metre to the corner of a brick wall at point C (Grid Ref. ST 6442 7236) where the path opens into the parking area and continues north westwards for 21m to Point B (Grid Ref. ST 6441 7238) as shown on the order map.

A copy of the order and the order map *and an explanatory statement* have been placed and may be seen free of charge at the Kingswood One Stop Shop, Kingswood Civic Centre, Kingswood during normal offices hours and at Hanham Public Library, High Street, Hanham, South Gloucestershire during normal opening hours. Please state the grounds on which they are made. Please note that all representations received may be considered in public by the Council and that the substance of any representation together with the name and address of the person making it could become available for public inspection.

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, South Gloucestershire District Council may confirm the order as an unopposed order. If the order is sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation any representations or objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with the order.
