

NOTICE OF MAKING OF AN ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

SOUTH GLOUCESTERSHIRE COUNCIL (FOOTPATH LWA 71 (PART) AND LDN 3A (PART) AT BURY HILL FARM, WICK) PUBLIC PATH EXTINGUISHMENT AND DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER 2019

The above order, made on 21 May 2019, under section 118 of the Highways Act 1980, will extinguish -

- 1) That part of footpath **LWA 71** in the parish of Wick and Abson running from Point A (Grid Ref. ST 7048 7299) 125m west of Bury Hill Farm south eastwards across a field for 120m to join Woodcroft Lane at Point B (Grid Ref. ST 7058 7292) where it also meets public footpaths LDN/4/20 and LDN/49/20, and
- 2) Footpath **LDN 3A** in the parish of Wick and Abson running from Point C (Grid Ref. ST 7045 7289) at public footpaths LDN 2 and LDN 3 north north eastwards for 100m to Point D (Grid Ref. ST 7055 7291) where it meets public footpath LDN 49 at 25m west of Woodcroft Lane - as shown on the order map.

A copy of the order and the order map have been placed and may be seen free of charge the Kingswood One Stop Shop, Kingswood Civic Centre, Kingswood during normal office hours and at Kingswood Public Library, High Street, Kingswood, South Gloucestershire during normal opening hours. Any representation about or objection to the order may be sent or delivered in writing addressed to the Head of Legal and Democratic Services at the undermentioned address quoting reference L3/DS/STOR/PT.6005 not later than **28 June 2019**. Please state the grounds on which they are made. Please note that all representations received may be considered in public by the Council and that the substance of any representation together with the name and address of the person making it could become available for public inspection.

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, South Gloucestershire District Council may confirm the order as an unopposed order. If the order is sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation any representations or objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with the order.
