

NOTICE OF MAKING OF AN ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

SOUTH GLOUCESTERSHIRE COUNCIL (FOOTPATHS LWA 71 (PART) AND LWA 72 AT BURY HILL FARM, WICK) PUBLIC PATH CREATION AND DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER 2019

The above order, made on 21 May 2019, under section 26 of the Highways Act 1980, will create –

- 1) a public footpath, numbered **LWA/71/20**, starting at Point A (Grid Ref. ST 7048 7299) running from 130m west of Bury Farm south south westwards for 10m where it crosses a field boundary through a gate then continues along the field edge for a further 90m to Point C (Grid Ref. ST 7045 7289) where it meets the junction of footpaths LDN 2 and LDN 3; and
- 2) a public footpath, numbered **LWA/72/10**, starting at Point F (Grid Ref. ST 7034 7286) where it meets footpath LDN 2, 30 metres south east of footpath LDN 1, running generally eastwards through a pedestrian gate then following on the north side of the brook for 175m to Point E (Grid Ref. ST 7051 7285) where it meets footpaths LDN 49 and LWA 51 - as shown on the order map.

Both paths will have a minimum width of 2 metres throughout.

A copy of the order and the order map have been placed and may be seen free of charge at Kingswood Public Library, High Street, Kingswood, South Gloucestershire during normal opening hours. Copies of the order and map may be bought at the undermentioned offices at the price of £6.50. You may also view the map relating to this notice on the Council's website at www.southglos.gov.uk/consultation

Any representation about or objection to the order may be sent or delivered in writing addressed to the Head of Legal and Democratic Services at the undermentioned address quoting reference L3/DS/STOR/PT.6247 not later than **28 June 2019**. Please state the grounds on which they are made. Please note that all representations received may be considered in public by the Council and that the substance of any representation together with the name and address of the person making it could become available for public inspection.

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, South Gloucestershire District Council may confirm the order as an unopposed order. If the order is sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation any representations or objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with the order.
