**Details of the proposed changes**

NOTICE is hereby given that South Gloucestershire District Council proposes to make an order under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 4(2) of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended the effect of which will be to vary the South Gloucestershire Council (Finch Road and Heron Way, Chipping Sodbury) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 2018 the effect of which will be to prohibit vehicles waiting at any time, subject to specified exemptions, in lengths of **Finch Road, Heron Way** and **Kingfisher Road**, Chipping Sodbury.

Full details of the proposal are contained in the draft order.
