

SOUTH GLOUCESTERSHIRE COUNCIL
(VARIOUS ROADS, CHARLTON HAYES) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 202(-)

Details of the proposed changes

NOTICE is hereby given that South Gloucestershire District Council proposes to make an order under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended the effect of which will be to:

- a) prohibit vehicles waiting at any time in lengths of **Borkley Street, Charlton Boulevard, Chessel Drive** and **Wood Street**, Charlton Hayes; and
- b) vary further the South Gloucestershire Council (Southern Brooks Area) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (Consolidation) Order 2012, as varied, in so far as it relates to **Charlton Boulevard**, the provisions of which will be brought forward into the new order.

Exemptions in the order permit any vehicle to wait for the purpose of boarding or alighting; loading or unloading goods; delivering postal packets; maintenance of the road; supply of gas, water or electricity; the pursuance of statutory powers or duties; taking in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage; weddings or funerals and in accordance with the current provisions for vehicles displaying a disabled person's badge.
