(A432 BADMINTON ROAD, COALPIT HEATH) (30 MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 202(-)

Details of the proposed changes

NOTICE is hereby given that South Gloucestershire District Council proposes to make an order under sections 82(2), 83(2) and 84(1) and (2) of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended the effect of which will be to:

- a) prohibit the driving of motor vehicles at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour in a length of **A432 Badminton Road**, Coalpit Heath; and
- b) vary further the South Gloucestershire Council (A432 Coalpit Heath to Nibley) (Restricted Roads) (40 mph Speed Limit) Order 2003 in favour of the provisions specified in item a) above.

Full details of the proposal are contained in the draft order.
