

**SOUTH GLOUCESTERSHIRE COUNCIL**  
**ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 - SECTION 23**  
**PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS**

**Details of the proposed changes**

NOTICE is hereby given that South Gloucestershire District Council in exercise of powers conferred by section 23 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, and after consultation with the chief officer of police, intends to install the following crossings in the District of South Gloucestershire:-

<u>Location</u>	<u>No. of Crossings</u>
A432 Badminton Road, Yate west of the roundabout accessing Badminton Road offices	1 Toucan Crossing – push button controlled
Badminton Road (access road to Badminton Road offices)	1 Parallel Crossing - uncontrolled

NOTE: 'Zig zag' markings will be installed either side of the above proposed crossing which will prohibit stopping on the approach or exit from the crossing.
