

NOTICE OF MAKING OF AN ORDER
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980
WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981

SOUTH GLOUCESTERSHIRE COUNCIL
(FOOTPATH PSN 44 AT SHORTWOOD ROAD, SISTON) PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION
AND DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER 2021

The above order, made on 24 November 2021, under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980, will divert that length of **public footpath PSN 44** in the Unitary District of South Gloucestershire in the Parish of Siston from Point B (grid reference ST 6907 7566), where it meets the unaffected part of public footpath PSN 44 at the field boundary, running in a north easterly direction across a field for a distance of 230 metres to Point A (grid reference ST 6926 7579) where it meets the adopted highway on Shortwood Road. Shown by a bold continuous line marked B - A on the order map –

to a line running from Point B (grid reference ST 6907 7566), where it meets the unaffected part of public footpath PSN 44, running in a northerly direction alongside the field boundary for a distance of 100 metres to Point C (grid reference ST 6906 7576) where it meets the shared use path (shown by a bold dotted line on the map) alongside Shortwood Road. Having a width throughout of 2 metres and shown by a bold broken line marked B - C on the order map.

A copy of the order, order map and an explanatory statement have been placed and may be seen free of charge at Kingswood One Stop Shop, Kingswood Civic Centre, Kingswood, BS15 9TR during normal offices hours. Any representation about or objection to the order may be sent or delivered in writing addressed to the Head of Legal and Democratic Services at the undermentioned address quoting reference L3/DFA/STOR/PT.6800 not later than 31 December 2021. Please state the grounds on which they are made. Please note that all representations received may be considered in public by the Council and that the substance of any representation together with the name and address of the person making it could become available for public inspection.

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, South Gloucestershire District Council may confirm the order as an unopposed order. If the order is sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation any representations or objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with the order.
