

## NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF AN ORDER

### HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

SOUTH GLOUCESTERSHIRE COUNCIL  
(FOOTPATHS LCA 15 AND LCA 21 AT VINE COTTAGE, LOWER HAMSWELL, COLD  
ASHTON) PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION AND DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT  
MODIFICATION ORDER 2022

On 26 October 2022, South Gloucestershire District Council confirmed the above order made under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980.

The effect of the order as confirmed is to divert that length of public footpath **LCA 15** in the Unitary District of South Gloucestershire in the Parish of Cold Ashton from Point A (grid reference ST 7341 7126) where it meets the unaffected part of the footpath near the field boundary, running in a south westerly direction across a field then entering the residential curtilage of Vine Cottage crossing a grassed area and the access drive for a distance of 130 metres to Point B (grid reference ST 7332 7117) then turning to a southerly direction running across a grassed area alongside the drive for a distance of 27 metres to Point C (grid reference ST 7333 7114) where it meets the adopted highway on Hall Lane and public restricted byway LCA 28. Shown by a bold black line marked A – B - C on the map contained in this order; and that length of public footpath **LCA 21** in the Unitary District of South Gloucestershire in the Parish of Cold Ashton from Point E (ST 7317 7131) where it meets the unaffected part of the footpath at the field boundary, running in a south easterly direction across a large field, for a distance of 182 metres then entering the residential curtilage of Vine Cottage running across a grassed area east to the cottage for 38 metres before meeting public footpath LCA 15 on the driveway at point B (ST 7332 7117). Shown by a bold black line marked E – B on the order map –

to a line running from footpath **LCA 15**: From the said Point A (grid reference ST 7341 7126) just beyond the field boundary running across a small field north east of Vine Cottage in a south south westerly direction for a distance of 109 metres to the corner of the field then entering the residential curtilage of Vine Cottage and running through a grassed area alongside the south eastern boundary fence for a distance of 31 metres where it passes through a field gate and continues for a further 9 metres to point D (grid reference ST 7333 7113) and meets public restricted byway LCA 28 on Hall Lane a few metres south of the cottage's driveway entrance. Having a width throughout of 2 metres and shown by a bold broken line marked A – D on the order map; and **LCA 21**: From the said Point E (grid reference ST 7317 7131) running from the field boundary towards the top of a large field north of Vine Cottage in a south south easterly direction down across the field for a distance of 168 metres to Point F (grid reference ST 7325 7116) where it meets public restricted byway LCA 28 and the adopted highway on Hall Lane to the west of Vine Cottage. Having a width throughout of 2 metres and shown by a bold broken line marked E - F on the order map.


A copy of the order as confirmed and the order map have been placed and may be seen free of charge the Yate One Stop Shop (next to the Leisure Centre), Kennedy Way, Yate during normal offices hours during normal opening hours. Copies of the order and map may be bought at the price of £6.50.

This order comes into force on the date which South Gloucestershire District Council certify that the terms of Article 2 of the order have been complied with, but if a person aggrieved by the order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not

been complied with in relation to the order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 2 November 2022, make an application to the High Court.
