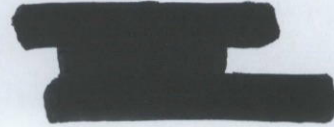

300 extra houses projected for Morton Way, Thornbury

We wish to register our objection to the above plan for the following reasons:

1. This would be the thin end of the wedge, and would open the way to a vast sprawl across the hillside as far as the A38.
2. Where would the new inhabitants be employed? Employment in Bristol would make an already badly overloaded traffic situation even worse.
3. Thornbury is not set up for all these extra houses whose inhabitants would have to use already overloaded services.
4. We cannot afford, as a country, to lose good agricultural land. Food security will become ever more important in the near future.
5. Lastly, we do not want to lose the lanes, the fields and the woods. This would badly erode our quality of life and change the nature of Thornbury as a country market town.
