6. ADDITIONAL COMMENTS

Marshfield has undertaken at least two surveys (2012 and 2013) the second of these was carried out by an independent organisation – Rural Housing Association who were commissioned by the PC to do this. 80+% of the returns indicated that they were satisfied that there is a need for more housing in Marshfield. Current house prices in Marshfield are prohibitive to young families and Marshfield has suffered an exodus of young people in recent years. Without redressing this situation properly the village is heading toward a demographic situation that is unacceptable for continued prosperity.

This is best seen by the decline in the day the Toddler group opens, a situation that will permiate up through the years as time goes on.
