(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 201[-]

Details of the proposed changes

NOTICE is hereby given that South Gloucestershire District Council proposes to make an order under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 4(1) of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended the effect of which will be to prohibit any vehicle waiting at any time in lengths of **Earlstone Crescent** and **School Road**, Cadbury Heath.

Exemptions in the order will permit any vehicle to wait for the purpose of boarding or alighting; loading or unloading goods; delivering postal packets; maintenance of the road; supply of gas, water or electricity; the pursuance of statutory powers or duties; taking in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage; weddings or funerals and in accordance with the current provisions for vehicles displaying a disabled person's badge.

Full details of the proposal are contained in the draft order. If you would like to see a copy of the draft order, a map, any orders to be varied/revoked and a statement of the Council's reasons for making the order, you may do so at the Kingswood One Stop Shop, Kingswood Civic Centre, Kingswood and at Cadbury Heath Public Library, School Road, Cadbury Heath, South Gloucestershire during normal opening hours.
