Details of the proposed changes

NOTICE is hereby given that South Gloucestershire District Council proposes to make an order under sections 84(1) and (2) of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended the effect of which will be to:

- a) prohibit the driving of motor vehicles at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour in **Poplar Lane** and in lengths of **Horwood Lane** and **Sodbury Road**, Wickwar;
- b) prohibit the driving of motor vehicles at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour in lengths of **Pincots Lane**, **Sodbury Road** and **Wickwar Road**, Wickwar; and
- c) vary further the South Gloucestershire Council (Various Roads, Wickwar) (Restricted Roads) (40 mph Speed Limit) Order 1998 in favour of the provisions specified in item a) and item b) above.

Full details of the proposal are contained in the draft order. If you would like to see a copy of the draft order, a map, any orders to be varied/revoked and a statement of the Council's reasons for making the order, you may do so at Yate One Stop Shop (next to the Leisure Centre), Kennedy Way, Yate during normal opening hours.
